## How many users can I have in my private domain?

There are no limits on the amount of users which can be created in a private domain.

## Deletion Policy

### You are deleting things?!

Since TitanPad is operated free of charge and had more success than we anticipated we needed to define a deletion policy for unused domains and pads. We've chosen quite liberal limits which shouldn't cause any problems for regular users but please take note that TitanPad is not an archival site. Please archive the work you care about somewhere safe.

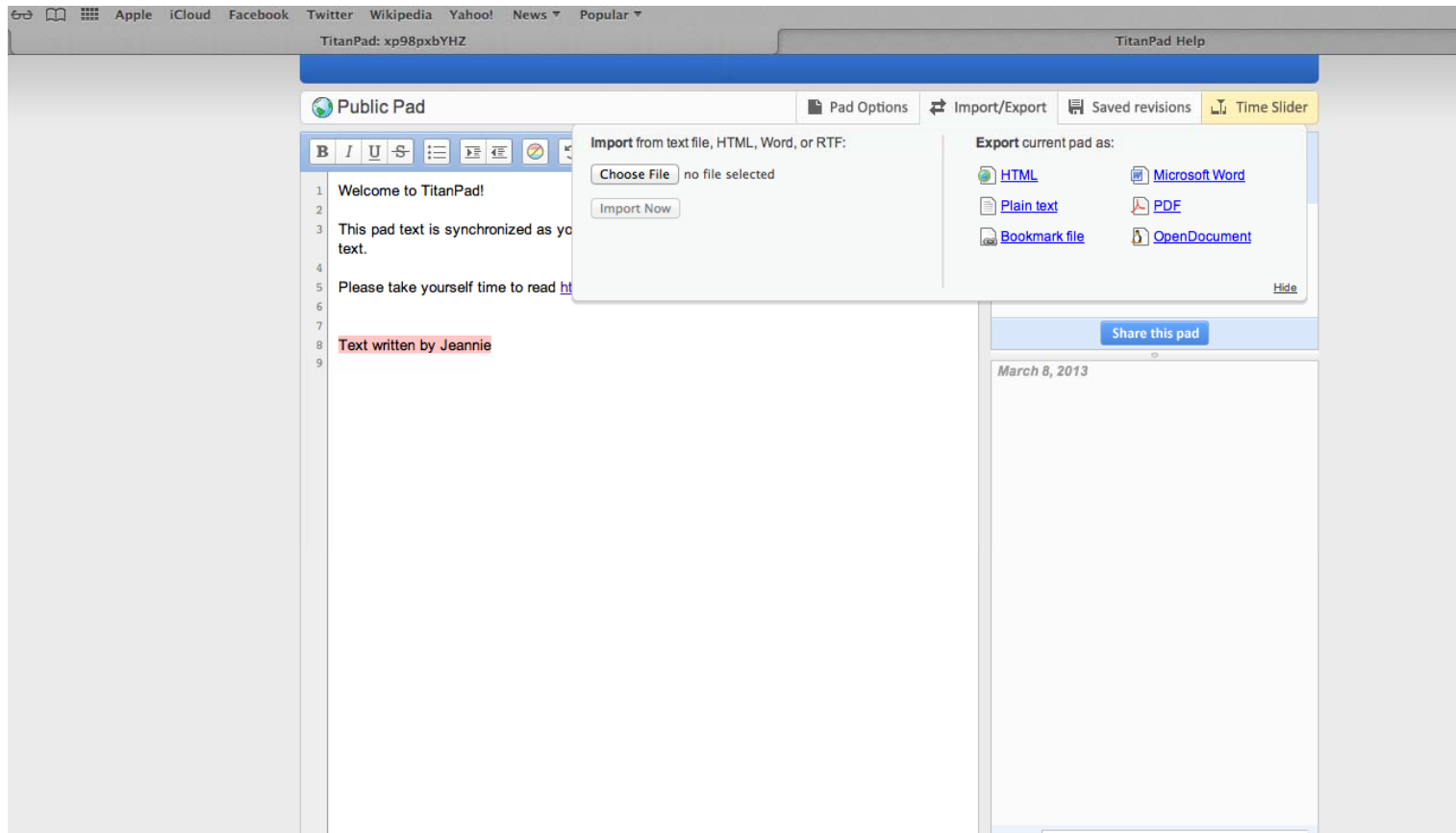
### How long will you store my public pads?

If your pad has less than 20 revisions (click the Timeslider in the upper right corner and look for "Version") we will delete it 2 weeks after it has been accessed the last time.

If your pad has less than 50 revisions we will delete it 2 months after it has been accessed the last time

All other public pads are kept for 12 months since the last time they've been accessed.

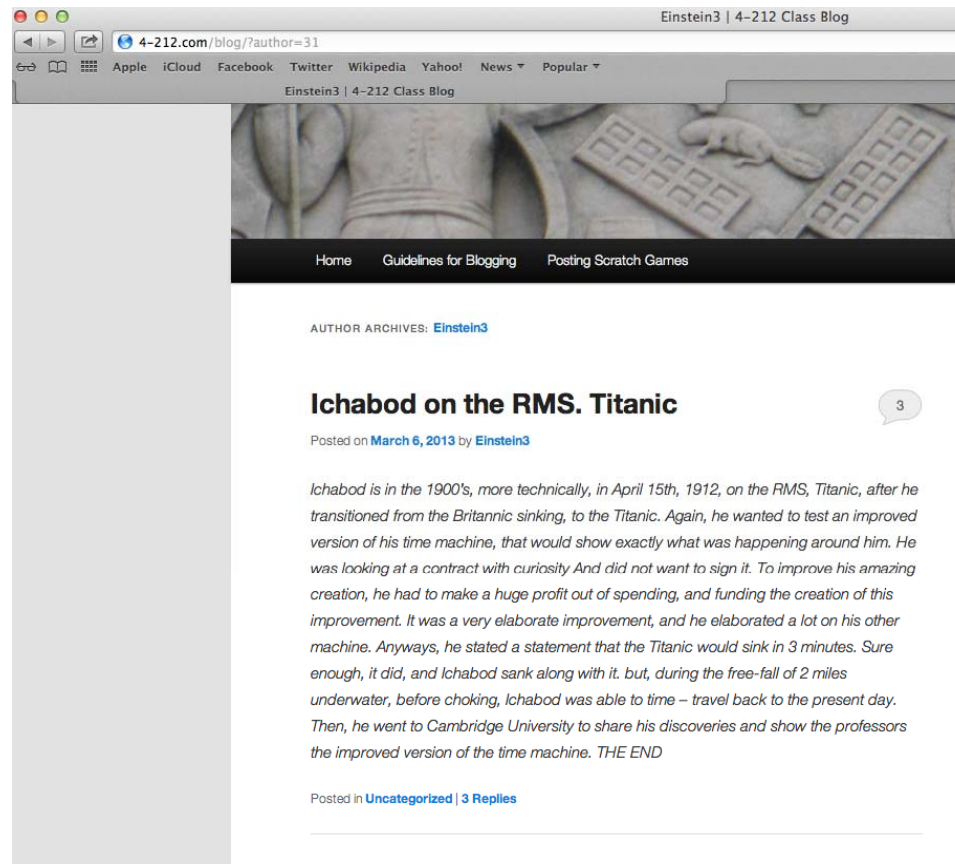

8. 5th Graders, please get in touch with me if you would like to post on the blog.

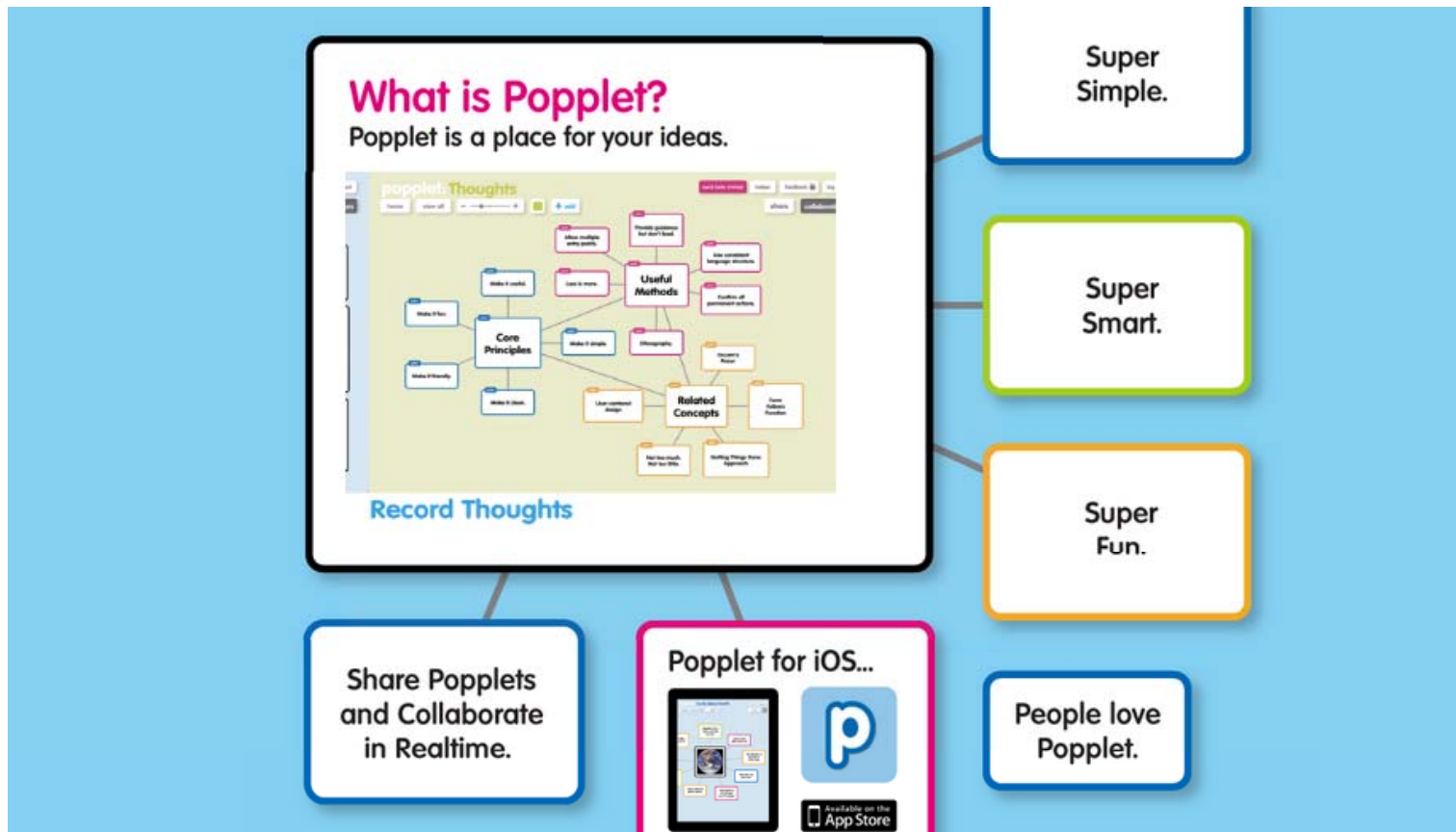

50 Word Short Story is the name of this writing game, a tiny literary genre with a proud tradition. It may seem tough, but it's relatively easy if you follow these rules and work at expressing your ideas succinctly.

- Exactly 50 words
- Aim to end your story with “a twist in the tale” or a “sting”.
- Do not write poems, riddles or jokes.
- Think of a beginning, middle and end

## 50 WORD SHORT STORIES: December 2011

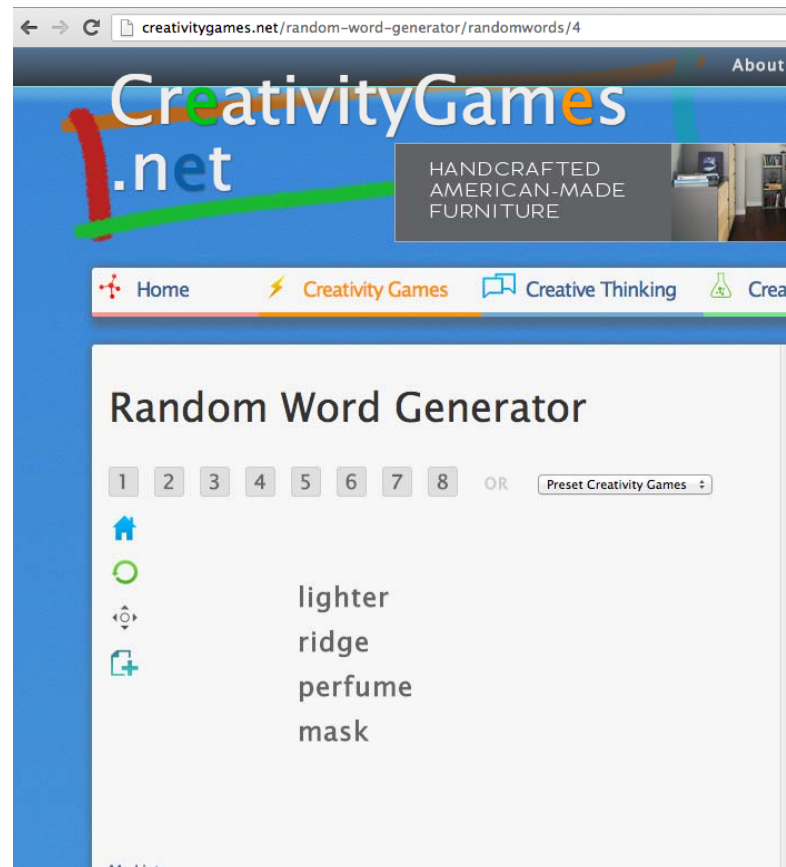

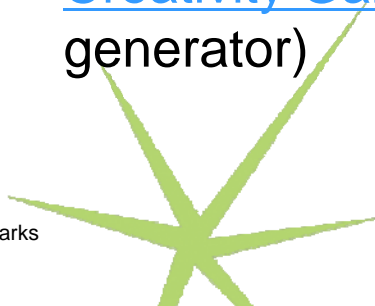

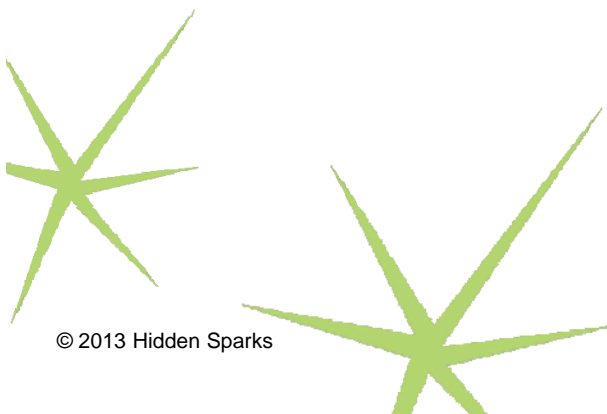

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# Applications for the 2013-14 Internal Coach Program Now Being Accepted!

The Internal Coach Program is designed to support a school's long term ability to address the needs of struggling learners by providing training to selected faculty members to be resident Hidden Sparks coaches – trained in understanding and teaching to diverse learning styles, behavior management, and classroom centered coaching. Similar to the Hidden Sparks External Coach Program, these Internal Coaches develop the expertise to become the resident experts on diverse learners. They receive training to facilitate monthly class-level meetings, offer workshops on diverse learning styles, and provide coaching to individual faculty members in order to identify specific learning strategies for students struggling in school.

## **ICP Course - Learning Lenses Curriculum**

Internal Coaches will be provided with two types of training. The core Hidden Sparks curriculum, called Learning Lenses (days 1-4), combines a neurodevelopmental approach to learning with an examination of temperament, behavior and ecology, to inform a deeper understanding of children's learning and behavior. The second aspect of the training (days 5 and 6) focuses on the role of a Hidden Sparks coach – mentoring adult learners, conducting classroom observations, providing constructive feedback, and facilitating group discussion.

***Application Deadline is Friday, April 5. Training begins in Spring 2013 so that Internal Coaches can begin coaching in their schools during the 2013-14 school year.***

*The Internal Coach Program currently operates in the New York/New Jersey metro area, Baltimore, Chicago, New Orleans, Nashville, Tampa and Hollywood, FL. However, with funding from a Covenant Foundation Signature Grant, we are expanding to additional cities. # About Hidden Sparks

**Hidden Sparks** is a non-profit fund whose purpose is to help children with learning differences reach their full potential in school and life. Hidden Sparks develops and supports professional development programs for Jewish day schools to help increase understanding and support for teaching to diverse learners.

Guided by a philosophy that by helping schools meet the needs of children with learning and behavioral differences, ultimately all students will benefit. Hidden Sparks' programs combine professional development in learning and positive behavioral support, guided classroom observation and one on one coaching. The Hidden Sparks model and program is currently in 24 Jewish Day Schools/Yeshivot in the New York metro area, 3 in Baltimore through a partnership with SHEMESH, and 2 in Chicago through a partnership with REACH. An additional 4 schools in Florida, Louisiana and North Carolina participate in a pilot program that combines an intensive in-person training course with ongoing "distance-mentoring" from a Hidden Sparks coach.
